A Note from Tri-County Office on Aging

Ingham County Elder Persons Millage

The Elder Persons Millage will be on the August ballot. The purpose of the millage is to help older adults 60+ live with independence and dignity in their own homes as long as possible.

In 2020, it was overwhelmingly approved 76% by the voters. Over 12,000 elders throughout the Ingham County have received services from this millage. But, many more are waiting for assistance.

If approved and levied in full, this Millage will raise an estimated \$2.9 million in the first calendar year of the levy, based on state taxable valuation.
